For optimal ultrasound training experience we would ideally be able to practice on each other. With that in mind, it is asked that each course attendee to consider volunteering to act as a model within each small group of four or five. We would like to stress that no one is obliged to act as a model or remove any clothing if they do not feel comfortable to do so.

What should I wear?

As lung ultrasound involves scanning various sites on the chest we kindly ask that attendees wear suitable attire that allows access to the chest wall but also maintains their dignity. Items such as sportswear or loose-fitting clothing would be suitable. Please also be aware that we will be using contact gel which could potentially damage/stain some items of clothing.
